

Each house is made of $12-2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares sewn together in strip sets. To make each house block, choose four $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and sew together, varying light and dark fabrics. Be sure directional prints will run from top to bottom in the finished block. Use a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam throughout (Figure 1).

Finished strip set measures $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} x$ ~10 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (height must be at least 10"). Press strip set seams in one direction. Make two more strip sets for a total of three.

Cut each strip set into four $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips (Figure 2).

Each house block will include one strip (of four $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares) from each of the three different strip sets (Figure 3). Ensure seams for each row are pressed in alternate directions.

## E-Z Village House*

8 1/2" x 10 1/2" finished

Kit includes fabric for four houses: 12-2 $1 / 2 \prime \prime$ fabric strips (min. $10^{\prime \prime}$ in length) Four 5" dark squares
Four 5" light squares
*The E-Z Village House pattern is an original pattern designed by Pat Anderson and Barri Breeden.

Stitch strip sets together. Press horizontal seams toward bottom of block.

At this point, your house block will measure $8 \frac{1121}{} \times 6{ }^{1 / 2 \prime \prime}$ (Figure 4).

The house roof is constructed of two half-square triangles, using one dark and one light 5 " square. Use a pencil to lightly draw a diagonal line across the wrong side of a light 5 " square. Place the $5^{\prime \prime}$ light square on top of the $5^{\prime \prime}$ dark square, right sides together. Sew a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on either side of the diagonal line. (To make this easier, you can first mark another line $1 / 4$ " on either side of the diagonal line and then sew on those lines (Figure 5).) Cut squares apart on the diagonal line. Trim each half square triangle block to $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (Figure 6).

Place dark sides together, stitch, and press seam open. This unit should measure $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Center this unit at the top of an $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ house block and sew both sections together. Press seam toward the house block. Do not trim finished block.
