PRACTICE TIME #3 - Half Square Triangles

If you need a brief refresher on making half-square triangles, Sheri Cifaldi-Morrill of Whole Circle Studios has this blog post about three ways to make them.



Using her measurements, if you want to make two at a time:

- cut two 5-1/2" squares to make two 4-1/2" unfinished HSTs or
- cut two 7-1/2" squares to make two 6-1/2" unfinished HSTs.

To make eight at a time, cut the squares twice as large (11" for eight 4-1/2" unfinished and 15" for eight 6-1/2" unfinished HSTs.)

One point she makes is that she often chooses her quilting design based on where she wants to end up (back where she started or elsewhere on the block).
