# Silvia B.

- ▶ Another stash buster. This is Pinehurst by Edyta Sitar. Finish size is 74 x 80. The back needed to be pieced just a little bit.
- ▶ Quilted by me using HQ Amara with ProStitcher.

- ▶ Another quilt to bust my stash. This is Wensleydale by Jen Kingwell from her book Quilt Recipes. I bought the book after Jen presented at our guild meeting. I made this quilt using her Foundation Paper pieces.
- ▶ Quilt finishes at 66 x 72.5. Quilted by me on my HQ Amara with ProStitcher.

# Janice J. - 1 of 3

- ▶ My Benicia guild issued a President's Challenge. We each BLINDLY picked a scrabble tile letter and a crayola crayon (64 pack) and were to use those two items as prompts for our creation. I got "N" and "Mauvelous".
- ▶ The N was a no-brainer for me because I have been investigating the Notan art form recently. We have a set of black and mauve dishes that we use for 'special' dinners, so placemats seemed to be just the ticket. I made two of each of these four designs.
- ▶ Coming up with quilting designs that would complement was fun. I especially liked quilting from the back on the last set - the curves in the antique map fabric were a great complement to the circles on the front of the placemat.

Horizontal Quilting

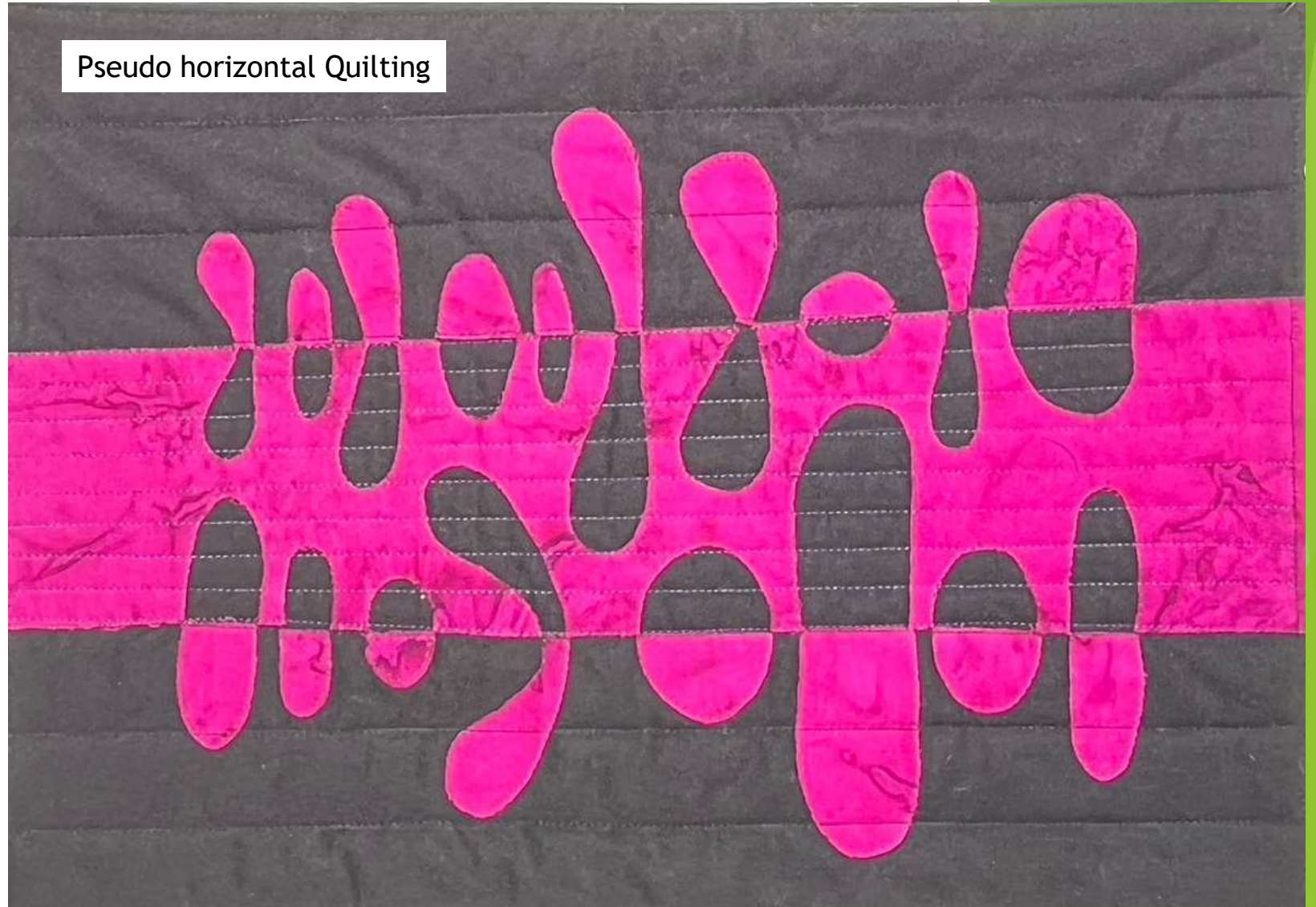




# Janice J. - 2 of 3

- ▶ I split the space in the mauve section into 7 quilting lines at each end and then drew straight lines to connect.
- ▶ I did the same for the outer black areas, doing just 2 quilting lines in top and 2 in bottom.
